### A Space that Attracts and Welcomes


The new Jerry Coughlan Building brings together a variety of clinical and medical services in one location, serving 6,000 children and youth in the community. Alongside an interdisciplinary clinical team, the facility also features an education partner, Grandview School, which enables children, who are Grandview Kids clients, to attend school while accessing their therapy services.

It was essential that the new building be a welcoming space that understands, embraces, and celebrates the inherent potential of children and youth. "We wanted a facility that didn't feel like a hospital. Many of Grandview's clients have spent considerable time in hospitals as infants and young children, which can be overwhelming and associated with negative memories," explains Lynne Wilson Orr, Principal, Parkin Architects.

Everything in the building is designed to support the therapeutic journey of their clients and their caregivers in a positive and uplifting manner. Starting outside with the arrival playground and sensory trail, through to the vibrant colors and welcoming architectural details that flow from the outside in, all coming together to create a sense of joy and wellbeing for children, youth and their families." Wilson adds, "We have incorporated a sense of whimsy throughout the space without it resembling a theme park."

Many colors are integrated throughout, starting with the building's exterior. The colorful experience continues within the building's interior via furniture finishes, artwork, and design details. 
